The Bike Enterprise Programmes continue their success with Chipego in Zambia restocking for the 12th time. Doffa received their first shipment since the start of COVID and in total AKP have sent a total of 15,214 to all the bike shops.

In Uganda, in partnership with Walkabout Foundation, and Bwindi Community Hospital, 100 wheelchairs were delivered and distributed to people that desperately needed help to become mobile.

Our Chief Tour Operating Officer Kerry Golds was in Uganda at the time and was able to get involved and see our team's efforts in action. She said, "One 7-year-old boy told me how life changing this was for him, now he could go to school and learn. I was amazed by the achievements of Bwindi Community Hospital. Their dedication to the healthcare of the local communities and education of nurses through their nursing school and their immense hard work and passion left me truly humbled."
