












# OUR EXPERT ADVICE ON MEDELLIN


### What you will Need

### For the dough:

- 250 gms sugar
- 250 gms sifted flour
- 250 gms butter, softened
- 5 Large eggs at room temp.
- 1 tsp pure vanilla extract
- A pinch of salt

### Instructions

- 1. In a clean and dry bowl, beat the egg whites until they double in volume. The texture of the beaten egg whites should be such that they form stiff peaks.
- 2. In a separate bowl, mix the sugar, the egg yolks, and the butter until the mixture is pale
- 3. Add the yolks, vanilla extract, and salt into the cake mixture. Then add the beaten egg whites and the sifted flour and fold into the roll mixture.
- 4. Divide the roll mixture into five and spread thinly into shallow pans, which should be lined with parchment. In a pre-heated oven (180 °C - 356 °F), bake one cake at a time until light golden.
- 5. On a clean kitchen towel, turn out the warm baked cake. Trim the borders of the cake. Spread a layer of the filling you've chosen and wrap quickly, with the help of the towel. Repeat the same process with every layer.
- 6. After 20 minutes, unroll the towel. Place the roll on a serving dish, slice, and enjoy with





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
